According to <u>safekids.org</u>, *children are twice as likely to be hit and killed by a car on Halloween* than on any other day of the year. If you've got kids trick-or-treating this year, make sure they can be seen by drivers passing by. *Use reflective tape or glow lights on their costumes*, and make sure they are accompanied by a responsible adult.

If you're expecting trick-or-treaters at your house, *make sure your yard and porch don't have any tripping hazards.* Also, keep candlelit jack-o-lanterns away from porches or anywhere costumes could brush against the flame. Finally, restrain any pets that may become excited and inadvertently jump on or bite trick-or-treaters.

Have a fun, safe Halloween weekend, and don't forget to set your clocks back on Sunday.
