COLONEL ROBERT V. LANKFORD

Colonel Robert V. Lankford is the Commander, 62nd Operations Group, Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington. He ensures the combat readiness of three C-17A Globemaster III airlift squadrons and an operations support squadron to conduct all aspects of C-17A operations, including mission planning, allocation, execution, command and control, training, scheduling, intelligence, aircrew flight equipment, weather, and airfield operations. The group has approximately 710 authorized personnel and 48 C-17A Globemaster III aircraft, providing safe and effective airlift, airdrop, and aeromedical evacuation capabilities for global combat and humanitarian contingencies. As the provider of the Prime Nuclear Airlift Forces, the 62nd OG holds the only squadron in the Department of Defense tasked to airlift nuclear and nuclear-related cargo. In addition, the 62nd OG serves as the primary active-duty unit in support of Operation DEEP FREEZE, partnering with Reserve, Guard, and civilian agencies to provide airlift support for the National Science Foundation's U.S. Antarctic Program.

Colonel Lankford was commissioned through the Air Force ROTC program at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte in 1998. He has operational and combat experience as a C-17 Pilot, an Air Liaison Officer, and B-1B Weapons System Officer. Colonel Lankford also served as the Commander, 21st Airlift Squadron at Travis Air Force Base, California. In this capacity, he was responsible for the training and equipping of over flying over 11,000 hours annually. 140 combat-ready personnel Following Squadron Command he served as the Executive Officer to the Commander, Air Mobility Command. Before arriving at Joint Base Lewis Mcchord, Colonel Lankford was the Air Force Fellow at the Weatherhead Center for International Affairs at Harvard University. Colonel Lankford is a Senior Pilot with more than 2,000 flight hours in the C-17A and the B-1B.
