PII breaches continue to be an ongoing concern in the Air Force. In 2013, Air Mobility Command had approximately 90

PII breaches that affected over 70,000 individuals. If you

suspect a potential PII breach, follow the reporting process and notify your supervisor and security manager right away. Continue to be vigilant and take the appropriate precautions before you send an email that may contain personal information.
