- 2. The four charities are the Air Force Aid Society, General and Mrs. Curtis E. LeMay Foundation, the Air Force Village, and the Air Force Enlisted Village. These are not charities you will see in your Combined Federal Campaign lineup. They are an example of Air Force members taking care of their own—Airmen Helping Airmen. Our annual campaign demonstrates this fact, that Airmen take care of our own!
- 3. Team McChord's goal for this year is \$71,668! Key workers should be visiting your work center soon to let you know all about the campaign. They will answer any questions you may have and give you the opportunity to donate if you should so choose. You will also be able to participate in the campaign through fundraising events. I encourage you to get involved if you can. This year, as noted by Secretary James, General Welsh, and Chief Cody *it's not about Airmen giving more*, *it's about more Airmen giving!* I invite our private organizations and units to be creative and have fun with fundraisers for AFAF over the next six weeks.
